


L.W.M.L. NEWS

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—June 13, 2023

Meeting was called to order at 6:27pm with 9 members in attendance.

The daily reading from Jesus Calling was read by Sue Boysel.

May Minutes were reviewed.

A motion was made and passed unanimously to approve May minutes as written.

Congregation Chair (Larry Neuenschwander):

Larry asked for an update from the sign committee which was appointed at last month's meeting to address the messages on the sign. Tante Lovins reported that the team met a couple of weeks ago to discuss the messages and the procedure for creating the slides. Currently Darl Beachy is using his personal laptop to create the slides. The Sign Committee proposed using a church laptop for all slides. Council agreed that would be best. The laptop in the sound booth should be capable of handling the capacity needed for the slides. The app will just need to be updated.

Discipleship Team (Karen Grieser):

- Suicide prevention breakfast ground beef donated, chicken cooked and frozen and ready to use.
- Last food pantry, 32 cars came through, 96 people.
- The team is working on welcome packages for visitors to Emmaus.
- Darl Beachy froze the electronic sign for the last pantry for the duration of the distribution, that seemed to help.

Trustee Team (Leo Raabe):

• Trustees received a request for a pavilion to be placed behind the parking lot. A quote for \$18,830.00 was obtained by the trustees for building a pavilion.

A motion was made and passed unanimously to not pursue building a pavilion at this time.

 Leo presented a quote from Allied Paving Co. in the amount of \$9,600 to extend, remove and replace the driveway for the parsonage. Council agreed to hold off on movement with the quote per update from Call Committee.

- Kitchen is a work in progress.

has decided to wait until the first of July until proceeding with putting the parsonage on the
market.


New Business:

Stewardship minute....

Are You Following God's Wisdom?

In the beginning, "God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness" (Genesis 1:26). In the second chapter of Genesis, we learn that God gave life to Adam and Eve, and, in their perfect state, they followed and trusted in God's wisdom. His wisdom was evident to them in His Word and in His creation. Life was very good. Unfortunately, they sinned, and the perfect image that was given to humanity is now damaged. Original righteousness was lost when Adam and Eve ate of the fruit, so they no longer loved, feared, and trusted God. Because of their sin, which separated them from God, Adam and Eve now followed the world's wisdom. Their ungodly living led them from true wisdom to folly and from life to death. Without God, all lives end in sorrow and ruin.

As Christians, we are rescued from the domain of darkness that accompanies the world's wisdom (Colossians 1:13). Through the work of the Holy Spirit, we are called and enabled to put off our old self so that the image of God in us can be renewed as we are made righteous and holy in God's sight (Ephesians 4:22-24). God's Word frequently reminds us of the foolishness of worldly wisdom. God's ways are far above the world's. *"The foolishness of God is wiser than men..."* (1 Corinthians 1:25). In His great wisdom, He sent His Son, Jesus, Wisdom Incarnate (Proverbs 8), into the world to become our sin on the cross. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, we have been reconciled to God. As forgiven and redeemed people, we understand how much we are loved and how we hurt our heavenly Father, and ourselves, when we follow the false and foolish wisdom of the world.

Would others identify wisdom as one of your gifts? How does it show? We need wisdom to understand who we are, what we are, and where we are going. Godly wisdom that leads us to fear, love, and follow God is essential if we are to live life wisely. God's wisdom leads us to be faithful stewards who use our time, talents, and money to glorify Him. With God's wisdom, we know Whose we are. God through Isaiah said, *"Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are Mine"* (Isaiah 43:1). Without Godly wisdom, life becomes disjointed, lacking direction and purpose. Proverbs 4:11 promises, *"I have taught you the way of wisdom; I have led you in the paths of righteousness."* With God's wisdom, we are able to live prudent lives that give God the honor He deserves.

May God help us all follow and trust His wisdom.





chart on the hallway bulletin board. The cost is \$30. Please make checks payable to Emmaus Lutheran Church and turn check into the office prior to the date.


