COMMUNICATION: Actively Listen...Have a Peaceful Spirit...Speak Clearly. The most important body part of Communication is your two ears. Listen to the words being spoken. Listen to the spirit and emotions. By the guidance of the Holy Spirit, ask appropriate questions. Follow the example of JESUS: Luke 2:46. Heed the counsel of Scripture: Hebrews 12:14, James 1:19+20. Communication is the on-going responsibility of all the Saints at Emmaus. Practice Holy Spirit lead Communication.

CHAIN OF COMMAND: By agreement, If I have thoughts, ideas, or concerns about congregational life and practice I begin by sharing them with the Board of Elders. CHRISTIAN CHARACTERS: Herman and Pauline. "Hermey" and Pauline were elderly and founding members of a small LCMS parish in Culver, Indiana. They were married for 50+ years and had no children. Their family were the Saints of the parish. They were one of the first to arrive at church on a Sunday morning. Herman would take up his post, sitting on a bench just outside the entrance to the Sanctuary, greeting everyone with a firm handshake and pointed stare. If you had not been to Worship in a while Herman would ask and pronounce for all to hear: "Where the H have you been? It's about time you showed up"! Behind his pointed remarks was a genuine concern for your welfare and a big soft heart. Pauline was always behind the scenes, making conversation and helping as needed. They were both very opinionated, firm in their beliefs. Yet they patiently listened to other points of view, voiced their concerns face to face, and were able to rise above the chaos and tension that was part of parish life. Herman and Pauline were married on Valentines Day. They both died and went to meet JESUS, one year apart, on Valentines Day. On the day Pauline died I visited her and Herman in the hospital. As Herman and I were waiting in the examination room for her to return from x-ray, he pointed to the brick wall in the room and commented that Pauline was as stubborn as that brick wall, since she had at first refused to come to the hospital. I chuckled to myself, knowing that if the situation was reversed, Pauline would have said the same thing about Herman. At the time it appeared that all was well and that they would return home later that day. Not long after I left, Pauline began to have trouble breathing. She lifted her arms, looked up to heaven, and breathed her last. Just that quick. One year later, to the day, Herman joined her. I can just imagine Pauline greeting Herman: "Where the H\_\_\_\_have you been? It's about time you showed up"! Thank You JESUS for Herman and Pauline!

## The Great Exchange

Let's recall for a moment Jesus' encounter with the Rich Ruler. This young man came to Jesus asking how he could inherit eternal life. First Jesus threw the law at him: Don't commit adultery, don't murder, don't steal, don't give false testimony, honor your parents. Without hesitation, the young man asserted that he had kept these commandments all his life. Jesus said: "One thing you still lack. 




