

FROM PASTOR BOB'S JOURNAL...CHARACTERS Dave and Joe

While I served Immanuel in Richton Park, IL it was decided to restore the pipe organ. Dave, a local organ builder and tuner, was given the contract. Joe, retired from a career in quality control, was Dave's assistant. Dave loved to talk. Joe was all business. Dave inherited the business from his

father and had a working knowledge of old pipe organs in the Chicago area as well as their histories. Joe knew nothing about organs. Joe did know how to organize. Each encounter with Dave and Joe began with multiple entertaining stories from Dave, the line between reality and fiction always blurry. Joe went about his business, , which consisted of quietly and efficiently organizing the day's tasks. When Joe finished organizing, he politely but firmly informed Dave that he was ready. The Odd Couple of the Organ Restoration business. As I observed this unique partnership, I discovered that organ restoration was a "rob Peter to pay Paul" operation. This was not deceitful, just realistic. Dave could never give a concrete date as to when a particular stage of the restoration would be completed. Many of the organ companies that made the old organs were no longer in business. Dave knew where the old organs were located, as well as their components. He would "rob' one to restore another. So it went until the restoration was completed.

Following McDonalds it was on to church to greet the preschoolers and parents. This is where I began the routine of "high-fives" with the children. I also assisted in the formation of a new Call Committee and prepared them for my departure I post Easter.

KEEP YOUR OPTIONS OPEN: A full-time Pastor, the traditional model, is not the only option. By June of this year, three Circuit congregations (Emmaus-IIM, St. Paul-Napolean-Clergy Retirement, Zion-Ridgeville -Clergy Retirement) will be vacant. Four of the five LCMS Circuit churches, within 20 Miles of Emmaus, worship less than 50 per Sunday. It may be time to reconsider multi-parish models.

I AM AVAILABLE 24/7 while in Wauseon. While in Wauseon I will be at Red Baron for Coffee and Conversation between 7a and 8:30a. Then it is on to church for "high-fives" with the preschoolers. If my Jeep is in the driveway I will be in the parsonage or office. Please stop in for "Schnutter" time.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—February 8, 2024

Meeting began, with 10 members in attendance, at 6:32 with an opening devotion by Pastor Bob-Look at every challenge as an opportunity.

January Minutes were reviewed and were unanimously approved as written.

Congregation Chair (Larry Neuenschwander):

- The offer for full asking price on the parsonage is proceeding. A home inspection and radon testing will be conducted in the coming days.
- A quote from Allied Paving for a driveway was presented. The quote was from June. The \$9,600 quote would likely be a little higher now. A new quote will be obtained.
- Adriane Baldwin has agreed to serve as the second signer on the investment fund.
- Larry proposed taking down some of the parking for "special needs" signs as we do not need that many.

Pastor's Report:

- Membership numbers baptized 259 and communicants 207
- Pastor has found a lead on an apartment at Cole St apartments. He asked for council's permission to pursue. The monthly rent is \$545 and includes water. Gas and electric will be extra. It was proposed to cut a check in the amount of \$1,000.00 to Pastor Bob to simplify clerical paperwork. Pastor will not sign until parsonage sale is complete.
- Pastor asked council to consider tithing to a charitable organization/mission on the sale of the parsonage.
- The comfort dog from St. Paul, Napoleon will be in attendance on February 25th for bible study and service.
- Pastor Bob noted a few observations from Sunday's meeting held after church. He reminds Emmaus of the importance of communication and following the chain of command.
- Next week Pastor and the elders will resume making shut in calls.

- Worship services complete through March. April services will be completed next week.


ALTAR FLOWERS
