



LWML Mites Report

Martin Luther once said, "We cannot give God anything, for everything is already His, and all we have comes from Him. We can only give Him praise, thanks and honor."

In the past 82 years, over \$100 Million has been contributed through MITE offerings. Thank you Emmaus for your generous noisy offering, \$179.73, on LWML Sunday. Your gift along with the contributions of others will provide perpetual funding to assist the LWML in continuing in its history of mission-ministry in the church, the community and among the people of the world. Out of all the MITES given, 75% stay in the Ohio District and 25% is sent to National.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—October 10, 2024

Meeting began at 6:30 pm with a Devotion on national disasters read by Roger Behnfeldt. 10 members were in attendance.

Minutes, September 12, 2024 were approved as written.

Congregation President's Report:

• Council needs to schedule a fall voters meeting. November 10 was suggested. Council will ask administrator to announce meeting in the bulletin in the coming weeks. Agenda for the meeting will include an update on the financial plan and call process.

Administrator Report:

- Worship services are complete through December.

Financial Officer's Report:

- Financial Review submitted by Bev Schlosser September offerings 8,744.89 September expenses <u>1,759.39</u> Positive net 3,339.94 YTD income vs. expenses negative 5,206.12 General Fund as of 10-10-24 \$22,081.98 Investments: Emmaus Fund 100,469.22 Parsonage proceeds 184,820.70
- Council discussed new Ohio Asphalt blacktop job. There is an area by the shed where the blacktop is not knitted the same causing a dip. There is a concern of water pooling in that area causing deterioration. Council asked Bev to hold off paying the invoice to Ohio Asphalt until we resolve the issue. The approx. \$63,000 invoice for this job will be paid out of proceeds from the parsonage sale.

Education Team Report:

 Tante Lovins reported that the Sunday School team decided to move the meeting time to 8:30 due to the varying/shorter sermon lengths with visiting pastors. A flyer has been created to invite Preschool and Wings of Change and any other children to Sunday School.

Elder's Team Report:

- Roger Behnfeldt called Pastor Schiewe to see where we stand. Pastor Morgan contacted 2 Interim Pastors
 on our behalf and they both declined. Pastor shortages continue all around. Hamler's Pastor will soon be
 retiring, making the need even greater. Zion Ridgeville held their Council mtg Monday night to discuss
 potential of dual parish with Emmaus. Roger has not heard from them as of Thursday. He will reach back
 out to hear how their mtg went.

- Leo Rabe reported Dean Schuette quoted \$2,850 for front sidewalk job.
- Beth Flory reported the Ability Center does not do chair lifts to commercial buildings. She is looking into outside companies, expects cost to run 5-6K.
- Custom Turf bid for snow removal is up for renewal. Council agreed to continue with Custom Turf.

Preschool Team Report:

- Enrollment M-W-F 8, M-F 1 the Tue-Thur children have joined the Mon Wed Fri class for now. The parents wanted their kids to be around more students. This arrangement is working well.

- Family fun night was not well attended, need better advertising for future.
- Little Caesar's fundraiser in progress.








Children's Sunday School Class, for 3 years old and up, will be from 8:30—9:30 am in the Emmaus room.

Stewardship minute....

Everyday Stewards

By God's grace working through His Word, we have been called and given the high honor of being His stewards (Genisis 1:28; 2:15). As God's stewards, we have the privilege and responsibility to manage faithfully, according to His will, all that He entrusts to us. We are expected to protect and care for His creation in a wise and benevolent way. Through faith, we understand that our lives are on loan from God. When God's grace and love fill our hearts, our stewardship is not limited to certain days of the week or specific acts, but instead, becomes a lifestyle. Stewardship is our response to the faith that God gives us through His Word and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Transformed by God's Spirit, we are enabled to acknowledge both our identity and purpose as God's stewards, and, as a result, we live as **Everyday Stewards**.

In His ministry on earth, Jesus, our Chief Steward, became our model for stewardship. In Jesus, we are delivered from the Law to stewardship motivated by the Gospel. At great cost, Jesus has freed us from the power of the Law with His innocent and precious blood so that we may serve Him in "everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness" (Luther's Explanation to the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed). Our motivation and strength to live as **Everyday Stewards** come from the power of the Cross.

In our sinful human nature, we do not want to be stewards. Our first impulse is the desire to be owners. We want to have possession of things. By God's grace, we become stewards who receive God's gifts thankfully, manage His gifts faithfully, and give them generously. Only when our hearts and minds are changed by the Holy Spirit do we embrace our identity as God's **Everyday Stewards**. As God's people, our minds and hearts have been changed so that we know our lives, gifts, and blessings are gifts from God. God is the source and owner of everything. "*The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof…*" (Psalm 24:1). "*The silver is Mine, and the gold is Mine,' declares the LORD of hosts*" (Haggai 2:8). No, nothing is ours, but God has given us the high calling of stewards. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in My name, He may give it to you" (John 15:16).

As God's stewards, we know that we have been given much responsibility. With responsibility comes accountability. "*Moreover*," writes the Apostle Paul, "*it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy*" (1 Corinthians 4:2). May we, like the two faithful stewards we read about in the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30), hear our Master's gracious words, "*Well done, good and faithful servant.*" God's blessings on your journey as **Everyday Stewards**.


