We made 212 blankets this year. We changed our Mission over the last couple of years. We've decided to focus on other local organizations to widen the Christmas cheer to more than just one place.

We have donated to Sara's Garden hyperbaric chamber, New Horizons School with Sara's Garden, and our Graduating Pre-School students. Other places we have donated to are, Sunshine Family Care Home in Archbold, the Ohio Soldiers and Sailors in Sandusky, the VFW Dad's Post 240 National Convention, SART to help children of sexual abuse cases, Suicide Awareness benefit, Devita dialysis, area nursing homes, Dr. Uribes and the Dominic Republic, the WFD and the WPD to show our support of their services to our community.

Our shut-ins received a huge handmade stocking filled with goodies for Christmas. We focus on our congregation's members during surgeries or other times of their need and community members we don't know, who have reached out to us with needs. We also donated to disaster relief thru the Red Cross and the Missionaries in Ft. Wayne. We try to help anyone who have a need as long as we have blankets to do so.

- Furnace filters need to be checked. Scott will contact Brian Baldwin for assistance.

Preschool Team (Bev Schlosser):

- 9 students enrolled in MWF class
- 7 students will graduate and two will remain as preschoolers.
- Poinsettia fundraiser profit- \$177 (57 plants sold)
- Christmas program will be held on December 18 at 6pm, meal to follow.
- Christmas break December 19, 2024 through January 3.
- Preschool shed has been reroofed by Dean Schuette.
- Acct. Balance \$25,957.96 ending balance as of 11/30/24.
- Preschool team presented the challenge of the preschool moving forward. The council discussed pros
 and cons of keeping the preschool open. Council carefully considered the future of the preschool. Due
 to it not being financially sustainable, low enrollment, and the public school announcing it will be adding
 a third public preschool classroom next school year, council made the decision to recommend closing.



Stewardship minute....

Opportunities Abound in the New Year

Each new day brings promise of a fresh start. For many, the start of a new week is the time to begin that diet, get serious about exercising, or forego TV viewing. For a vast majority, though, there is something especially motivating and invigorating about seeing the JANUARY calendar on the wall. This is the year we will accomplish great things.

God does not necessarily call us to do great things. However, He asks that we be trustworthy in small things. Jesus said, "One who is faithful in very little is also faithful in much" (Luke 16:10). To that end He gives us gifts, both small and big, to use to build up the Body of Christ and to reach out to the lost.

Some of us have many gifts. People like Michelangelo – painter, sculptor, and poet – and Thomas Jefferson – architect, statesperson, and scientific farmer – come to mind. God, the Giver of gifts, knows that the number of gifts each of us has varies. Jesus told the Parable of the Talents pointing up this fact and teaching us that success lies in using what we have been given, not in having the greatest number.

Our gifts also differ in degree. There are many sculptors but few, if any, compared to Michelangelo. Yet their art can bring satisfaction and inspiration to others. You may not be able to sing opera, but you can sing God's praises. You may not be a great orator, but you can witness to the love and grace of God in Christ. You may not be a mechanic, but you can provide transportation for someone needing to get to an appointment or to church. You may not be a wealthy corporate CEO, but you can use some of your funds to help those in need and to extend God's kingdom.

That is why God gives us gifts and abilities so we may be equipped to serve others. "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Peter 4:10). The start of a new year offers us an opportune time to assess those gifts and see how we can use them for God's glory and the good of His people. The motivation to do this comes from the same One Who gave the gifts! Just as He was motivated by love for us to give us, not just our gifts, but His greatest gift, His Son, so we are motivated by love for Him to serve those He calls us to serve.
