Pastor's Message

PASTOR BOB'S JOURNAL AND REFLECTIONS

FIRST CALLS...Messiah, Waldorf-MD and Messiah, Elkhart-IND. My first two Calls were disasters. My own immaturity, naivete, mistakes, and control issues were contributing factors. Another part of the picture was how these two parishes formed. Both were Mission Churches, breakoffs of a larger local LCMS church, sponsored by Districts of the

LCMS. At the time, little attention was paid to internal parish dynamics. The idea of starting a new "Mission" was enough for Districts to open their checkbooks. The two Messiah's were led by lay leaders who had their own internal control issues, and who had a rebellious attitude towards authority in general, and clergy in particular. They were Protest Movements. Protest Movements die. Both Messiah's closed within a few years. Fortunately, LCMS has become more aware of internal parish dynamics, and has become more discerning about starting new Missions. Another factor is realizing that not all Ordained Clergy are fit for 21st Century Parish Ministry. Seminary education trained us to pastor churches of the early 1900's, a church that no longer exists.

CULVER YEARS...1987-2001...THE REST OF THE STORY...THE END...Gossip and Eights Commandment Issues plagued Trinity throughout my tenure. Twice I addressed the issue from the pulpit, resulting in temporary cease fires. After the third time, I let loose hell fire and brimstone on a Sunday Morning, resulting in threats of a "tar and feathering" if I returned the next Sunday. Through the intervention of a few supporters, a severance was negotiated. Late on the following Saturday evening I drove to Culver, packed my belongings, left the keys, picked up my check, shook the dust off my feet, allowed the door to shut behind me, and returned home. The Circuit Visitor negotiated a severance. There was no response from District. This began a "cooling off" period of about four months. I continued to work at the hospital. The Lord was preparing me to serve Immanuel-Richton Park II. From the frying pan into the fire.

CONGREGATION DYNAMICS...From personal experience, there are two types of types of people who tend to be disruptive and stifle meaningful growth in a congregation. One is the person who needs attention. The other is the person who needs to be in control. This description is not gender specific. Nor is it role specific. Lay people and Clergy are equally involved and guilty. Both characteristics can be in the same person. Generally, the person needing control works behind the scenes, manipulating a person or persons needing attention to do their bidding. Congregation Focus usually is on the person needing attention, leaving the person with control issues free to carry on the disruptive behavior behind the scenes. Trivial matters become sources of controversy. Molehills become mountains. The person with control issues generally has experienced some type of abuse in their formative years and has a deep resentment toward authority. I will share a concrete example next month.

LOOKING AHEAD...MOVING FORWARD...WHAT DOES THE FUTURE LOOK LIKE FOR EMMAUS? It is my sense that, guided by the Holy Spirit, that Emmaus is ready to persue a Vision for the future. For now, I am not asking for a restart of the Call Committee. Consider the following Question: What type of Pastor does JESUS want for EMMAUS? This points to a shift in perspective, from "What do we want?" to "What does JESUS desire? Also, there are alternatives to the traditional model for Pastoral Care. These include but are not limited to: Worker-Priest...Lay Deacon...Dual or Multi-Parish...Special Ministry Pastor (SMP). I have encouraged Emmaus Leaders to schedule discussion meetings during the Summer. These will not be decision making meetings. I will also make mention of this in messages and Sunday Bible Class.

COMMUNICATE...COMMUNICATE...Please keep the Lines of Communication open on all levels. Pray...Listen...Speak Clearly...Ask Questions for Clarification...Do Not Assume... Give Clear Honest Answers...Speak the Truth in Love...It is OK to say: "I don't know".

IIM/IIT THOUGHTS...Learn Lessons from the Past. Don't Live in the Past. Keep Moving. Retired Fort Wayne Seminary President and LCMS Historian Larry Rast once commented: "The Good Old Day's Never Were". People live. People die. People Move On. Pastor's Live. Pastor's Die. Pastor's Move On. It is my intention to stay at Emmaus until the next Pastor has accepted a Call and is on site. Every Plan is subject to change guided by the Holy Spirit. JESUS is Permanent and Forever!

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—May 9, 2024

Meeting began at 6:32 with a reading from Jesus Calling by Larry Neuenschwander. 4 members in attendance.

April Minutes were reviewed and were unanimously approved as written.

Congregation Chair (Larry Neuenschwander):

- Larry has received requests for locking doors to the church after the service starts due to safety concerns, recent violence at churches. Council discussed locking all doors except the east door. Discussion as to who will be in charge of locking the doors. A suggestion to have a few individuals in the church to form a "Safety Team" to handle locking the doors and any other safety issues that arise. Elders will discuss what to do, how to handle this concern. Once this new policy begins, the doors that will be locked will have a sign on them that says beginning at 10am the door will be locked, use front door. It will also be announced by Pastor for several weeks until people get used to it.
- Larry was asked that the council consider a donation to the Smitty family with money from sale of
 parsonage. There will be a benefit for the family in coming weeks. Council considered a match
 donation of up to a designated amount. Tabled discussion due to lack of details as to what the
 donation will be for. Council agreed to donate but will make a decision of how much when we
 learn details.
- Larry reported that a letter has been drawn up by the attorney that purchased the parsonage in regards to liability of the new home owners children playing on the preschool playground equipment. The church will not be held liable for any injuries/accidents.

- Adriane, Tante, Bev Schlosser, along with Pastor met with someone from the education team at Ohio District. She was able to answer a couple of questions about moving forward with the Sunday School class and any other educational classes. Teachers do not have to be 18 years old to teach, but it is strongly recommended that there be more than 1 in adult per class. Teachers do not have to be fingerprinted or watching a video about preventing abuse, but it is strongly encouraged. Tante will schedule a meeting during the summer to plan fall and winter curriculum and access any needs.






Thank you to all of our members who have volunteered to deliver meals on wheels this past month.

Stewardship minute....

Our Best Intentions

"I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate" (Romans 7:15), so spoke the Apostle Paul. Somehow, he could not translate his best intentions into the actions he wished to do. This is the dilemma that has afflicted all Christians who sincerely want to do God's will.

Peter experienced it too. "Lord, I am ready to go with You both to prison and to death" (Luke 22:33), he declared, and he meant it. His best intentions were to stick with his Lord, no matter what. Yet Peter denied knowing his Lord, and, along with all the disciples, fled in fear the night of Jesus' betrayal (Mark 14:50). What he wanted to do, he failed to do. What he wanted not to do, that is what he did. We understand the dilemma well. Like Peter, we weep when faced with our failures. But we do not despair, for we have learned that, while on our own we fail, but with God we can do great things.

Christ went to His death on Calvary in order to buy us back from sin, death, and the devil. We are no longer captive to sin and immobilized by it. "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him Who loved us" (Romans 8:37). Jesus lived the perfect life for us; He shed His blood in payment for our sins; He suffered in our places; and He gives us grace that forgives our failures and gives us more opportunities to bear the fruit He called us and chose us to bear. Truly, with God we can do great things.


