Discipleship Team (Sue Boysel):

- Food pantry served 34 cars last month.
- Suicide awareness Poker Run was held. Over 130 motorcycles participated.
- The Wings of Change BBQ generated \$1140. Donations were given to Serenity Springs and 2 homeless shelters.

Trustee Team (Leo Rabe):

- The Spectrum equipment has been returned.
- The repaired roof had a significant leak in the narthex. Larry Neuenschwander has called the company he provided repairs. As a result, the ceiling tiles will need to be replaced. Trustees will take care of purchasing and installing.
- New concrete has been poured under awning on south side of church.
 - A motion was made and passed unanimously to use Rosemary Lind memorial funds to cover the \$4300 cost.
- Council revisited the need for an elevator or chair lift down to the fellowship hall. Beth will check with the ability Center to see about options.

- <u>Teaching position</u> A teacher has been hired!! Sallyann Miles from Defiance Ohio signed the contract 8.7.24. She has previously taught at St. John Lutheran School in Defiance.
- Roundup Day- August 26 and possibly 27th at 6:30pm The first day of school will be September 9.
- <u>2024-2025 Registrations</u> 10 students registered, with an additional pending registration coming.
- <u>Playground Compliance</u> it appears the slats can just be moved to be in compliance with ODJFS guidelines.
- The Schuette's could possibly replace the preschool shed roof later this fall.


New Business:

Stewardship minute....

Who Gives the Most?

I would like to pose three scenarios: The first one is this: In today's offering, you place a check for \$50.00. Second: a 9th grader sitting close to you tosses in a dollar. Third: the person right in front of you puts in a check for \$300.00. The question is this: Who gave the most?

Now let us go back in time and observe a Pharisee who walks through the inner court of the temple and tosses into the temple treasury a bag of gold. Then shift your focus to a widow who slips in almost unnoticed and places two small copper coins into the same temple treasury. Who gave the most?

The answer is found in Jesus' Words: "I tell you the truth,' He said, 'this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:4).

You see, God does not measure our gifts by the size of the gifts, but according to the condition of our hearts. God knows when giving is given out of faith, love, and gratitude for His countless blessings that He gives to us. Not only does He know the priorities of our hearts, but He also knows the giving capabilities that we have. When we give our offerings, He knows what we are keeping for ourselves, and He knows if we are giving sacrificially of what we have. Only as our relationship with Jesus grows will we be able to give greater proportions of what we receive.

Proportionate giving is fair to the rich and the poor. A person who earns \$10,000 and gives \$1,000 is giving the same proportion as a person who earns \$100,000 and gives \$10,000.

Going back to our original scenarios, wouldn't we agree that the person who gave \$300.00 gave the most? Certainly \$300 is greater than the dollar given by the 9th grader. However, from God's perspective, the 9th grader with the one dollar may have given a more meaningful gift than the person who gave \$300. If the dollar is given from a loving and grateful heart and if it represents a generous proportion of the youngster's income, the gift will please God. A gift of \$300 could sadden the Lord if it is given without faith and if it represents only a token amount of one's income. Jesus said, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked" (Luke 12:48).

May God grant us the same faith as He did the widow so we, too, can give proportionately, generously, and perhaps even sacrificially.
