

Stewardship minute....

Being a Committed Steward

Through the work of the Holy Spirit, we become committed stewards, who use our time, talents, and resources to help and serve others, build God's Church, and expand His kingdom. Even though you and I are undeserving, God honors us with the privilege of being His stewards.

- In Genesis 1:28, we learn that God gives us dominion over all His creation.
- In Genesis 2:15, we are given the task of tending and caring for what He has created. In Psalms 8:6, we read that God has made us overseers and rulers over the works of His hands. God's Word gives us our authority, responsibility, privilege, and duty to be stewards of His creation. Our stewardship is to reflect the same love and concern that God has for all He has created.

As stewards, we are managers or caretakers, not owners of all that God entrusts to us. He has created and still owns and sustains all things. Everything we have is His. Faithful stewards remember that all we have and all we are is because of God. In Psalm 24:1 we read, "The earth is the LORD's…" We are God's stewards entrusted with the management of the world. On our own, we are incapable of becoming stewards, but we have been reconciled to God through Christ's life, death, and resurrection making us new creations. God becomes the source of our strength. We become His hands, feet, and mouth, as He works through us in our stewardship. As faithful stewards, our acts of stewardship are efforts that always seek to praise God.

By God's grace, we become committed stewards who are faithful, prayerful, grateful, generous, and service-oriented. Being committed stewards implies that our stewardship is not a part-time position. It is our whole life response to God's grace and love. It is much more than helping our neighbors occasionally or placing an offering in the collection plate. Living with the perspective of being stewards changes our lives. Being stewards is what we are, which determines what we do. "And whatever you do, in word and deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17). We are called to be stewards in our homes, neighborhoods, schools, and workplaces. God wants us to use our time, talents, and resources for His glory. Blessings on your stewardship journey!


