Announcing 2025 – 2027 Mission Grant Proposals Ballot Set Lutheran Women in Mission, also known as Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML), is excited to announce the list of mission grant proposals selected for the voting body to review and pray over, leading up to the 41st Biennial Convention in Omaha, Nebraska. The LWML Mission Grant Selection Committee received 112 proposals from ministries focused on mercy and gospel proclamation work in the United States and overseas. After careful prayer and discernment, the committee narrowed the proposals to a final list reflecting the most pressing ministry needs. As proclaimed in the book of Matthew "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few" (Matthew 9:37); we recognize the immense need for support. While the need is great, Lutheran Women in Mission must focus on what is possible in this current time through its mite offerings and grants. We are grateful to each ministry that submitted a proposal and continue to pray for your mission work. The final list of 47 proposals, approved by the Board of Directors and Presidents Assembly, can be seen below. They will be voted on prior to the 2025 convention by the certified delegation through an online balloting process.



Stewardship minute....

Called to Serve Others

Throughout all four Gospels, we read how the life of Jesus was one of total service and sacrifice. Jesus declared, "even as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). Jesus continually served the hungry, handicapped, sick, and homeless. His loving and servant heart was seen in all that He said and did. Following His example during the three years He spent on earth, we realize that our purpose, too, is to serve. He lived for His heavenly Father and for others. Just as Jesus served His Father, we exist to serve Him. Being conformed into the image of Christ we will take on the role of servants as He did.

The concept of serving rather than being served is not a natural one. We, by nature, prefer to be "number one." We're too wrapped up in ourselves even to notice the needs of others. Jerry White, in his book Honesty, Morality, and Conscience, writes.

Christians are to be servants of both God and people, but most of us approach business, work, and life in general with the attitude of what I can get rather than what I can give. Serving God receives a favorable response but serving people, especially those who cannot repay us, has no visible benefit or glory from anyone except God.

A life of service is contrary to what our society promotes. We are told that we should aspire to fame, power, and wealth. Servants receive no glory, spotlight, or fame, but a meaningful relationship with Christ is not possible if we put ourselves first and seek only the goals that are important to the world that we live in. Living a life of service, we give of ourselves without striving for financial rewards or glory. Unlike the praise we receive from God, worldly praise has no lasting value. Along with the Apostle Paul we say that we are "not to please man, but to please God Who tests our hearts" (1 Thessalonians 2:4).
